AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in preliminary provisions, further
- 6 providing for Keystone Exams.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 121(a) of the act of March 10, 1949
- 10 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949,
- 11 amended February 3, 2016 (P.L.1, No.1), is amended and the
- 12 section is amended by adding subsections to read:
- 13 Section 121. Keystone Exams. -- (a) [Subject to annual
- 14 appropriation, not later than the 2020-2021 school year, the]

- 1 The Department of Education shall develop and implement Keystone
- 2 Exams in [the following subjects:] algebra I, literature[,
- 3 biology, English composition, algebra II, geometry, United
- 4 States history, chemistry, civics and government and world
- 5 history.] and biology. The State Board of Education shall
- 6 promulgate regulations, subject to the act of June 25, 1982
- 7 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the "Regulatory Review Act,"
- 8 necessary to implement this section.
- 9 * * *
- 10 (c) Notwithstanding section 2604-B(b)(2)(v), 22 Pa. Code §
- 11 <u>4.24 (relating to high school graduation requirements) or 4.51</u>
- 12 <u>(relating to State assessment system) or any statute or</u>
- 13 regulation to the contrary, in any school year in which a
- 14 <u>demonstration of proficiency on a Keystone Exam is required for</u>
- 15 <u>high school graduation</u>, a CTE Concentrator shall be deemed
- 16 proficient provided that the CTE Concentrator shall meet all of
- 17 the following requirements:
- 18 (1) completes locally established grade-based requirements
- 19 for academic content areas associated with each Keystone Exam on
- 20 which the CTE Concentrator did not achieve proficiency. For the
- 21 purposes of this paragraph, completion of grade-based
- 22 requirements in any science and technology and environment and
- 23 ecology course shall satisfy the requirements for the academic
- 24 content area associated with the Keystone Exam in biology; and
- 25 (2) completes one of the following:
- 26 (i) attains an industry-based competency certification
- 27 <u>related to the CTE Concentrator's program of study; or</u>
- 28 (ii) demonstrates a high likelihood of success on an
- 29 approved industry-based competency assessment or readiness for
- 30 continued meaningful engagement in the CTE Concentrator's

- 1 program of study as demonstrated by performance on benchmark
- 2 <u>assessments</u>, course grades and other factors consistent with the
- 3 CTE Concentrator's goals and career plan.
- 4 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 6 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 7 <u>"Approved industry-based competency assessment." A NOCTI</u>
- 8 <u>exam</u>, NIMS assessment or other industry-based competency
- 9 <u>assessment identified by the Secretary of Education and approved</u>
- 10 by the State Board of Education.
- 11 "CTE Concentrator." A student who, by the end of a reporting
- 12 year, will be reported as successfully completing at least fifty
- 13 percent (50%) of the minimum technical instructional hours
- 14 required under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 339 (relating to vocational
- 15 education).
- 16 "NIMS assessment." An assessment based on the National
- 17 Institute for Metalworking Skills standards.
- 18 "NOCTI exam." A National Occupational Competency Testing
- 19 Institute exam.
- 20 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
