AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in limitation of time, 2 further providing for six months limitation, for infancy, 3 insanity or imprisonment, for no limitation applicable and for other offenses; and, in matters affecting government units, further providing for exceptions to sovereign immunity, for limitations on damages in actions against Commonwealth parties, for exceptions to governmental immunity and for limitations on damages in actions against local parties. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. Section 5522 of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania 14 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a subsection to read: § 5522. Six months limitation. 15 * * * 16 17 (c) Exception. -- This section shall not apply to any civil 18 action or proceeding brought under section 8522(b)(10) (relating 19 to exceptions to sovereign immunity) or 8542(b)(9) (relating to 20 exceptions to governmental immunity).
