OPPOSE SB 291 SEN. MILLS



BAD MEDICINE FOR LOUISIANA CITIZENS - UNSAFE ACCESS TO PHYSICAL THERAPISTS

SB 291 by Sen. Mills eliminates restrictions on implementation of physical therapy services without a prescription or referral from a physician. If passed, **SB 291** would allow physical therapists to treat patients directly and indefinitely, without ever receiving an assessment or diagnosis from a medical doctor.

Federal regulation would make this legislation impossible to implement. Medicare requires physician approval for all physical therapy treatment plans.

HOW WILL THIS BILL ENDANGER THE PUBLIC?

Physical therapists are not trained to diagnose. Effective medical treatments could be delayed with life-threatening outcomes. This is a drastic expansion of the physical therapy scope of practice beyond training.

WHAT IS BEST FOR THE PATIENT?

Each professional working in their area of expertise and sharing information with each other. This bill is dangerous by allowing physical therapists to treat patients beyond their scope of education and training. Louisiana Orthopaedic Association and 10 statewide health care organizations are opposing this legislation due to patient safety concerns. When patients go to a physical therapist, the goal is to receive *treatment*, not a *diagnosis*. When a patient sees a medical doctor, the goal is the *diagnosis* followed by a decision about the *best treatment* - drawing from the full spectrum of medical knowledge. The best treatment could include physical therapy. Physicians will continue to prescribe physical therapy to patients who can benefit from this kind of treatment. But a patient with a health problem needs to be seen by a physician to truly evaluate the source of their symptoms or discomfort.
