Arrest made in stabbing in N.J. convenience store worker, cops say

A 34-year-old man has been arrested a month after authorities say he robbed stabbed a worker at a convenience store in Atlantic City in what police described as an "unprovoked attack."

Francisco Bonilla was taken into custody Monday in Vineland and charged with attempted murder, aggravated assault and weapons offenses, Atlantic City police said.

Bonilla stabbed the employee at the store on the 100 block of north Rhode Island Avenue just before 8:20 a.m. on Feb. 3, officials said.

The 39-year-old clerk was hospitalized with serious injuries.

Attorney information wasn't immediately available for Bonilla, a homeless Atlantic City resident.
